## National TRIO Week



National TRIO Day was established in 1986 - making this year's celebration National TRIO Day's 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary. This past week, Northern's Student Support Services (SSS) celebrated National TRIO Week by holding an open house with refreshments on Wednesday. The seven TRIO programs- grant funded- by the US Department of Education are as follows: Educational Opportunity Centers, Upward Bound, Veterans Upward Bound, Talent Search, Upward Bound Math and Science, Student Support Services, and McNair Programs.

## Blood Drive

March is Red Cross Month. On Wednesday, March 9<sup>th</sup>, American Red Cross will be here from 11:00 AM to 4:00 PM at the Student Union Building for our Spring Blood Drive. For the blood drive, identification will be required. You may sign up by calling 1-800-RED-CROSS or you may go to [redcrossblood.org](http://redcrossblood.org). Call Jamie Smith RN at Student Health Services 265-3599. Donating is easy. It only takes about an hour; the actual donation procedure itself usually takes less than 10 minutes. It is best to have an appointment to cut down on waiting time but walk-ins are welcome. You can donate whole blood every 56 days. The average adult body holds 10-12 pints of blood, but a donation consists of about one pint. If there is anyone who wishes to donate their time in helping check in donors or with refreshments, please contact Jamie. This is an excellent way to help if you are squeamish about donating. Any help would be greatly appreciated.

1. Get a good night's sleep.

## Recycling Facts & Tips

2. Have a good breakfast or lunch.
3. Drink extra water and fluids to replace the volume you will donate (avoid tea, coffee, or other beverages with caffeine).
4. Eat iron-rich foods: red meat, fish, poultry, beans, iron-fortified cereals, raisins or prunes.
5. Avoid fatty foods such as hamburgers, fries or ice cream before donating.

**During donation:**

1. Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow.
2. Relax.

**After the donation:**

1. Rehydrate by drinking plenty of fluids over the next 24-48 hours.
2. Avoid strenuous physical activity or heavy lifting for about five hours after donation.
3. If you feel light headed, lie down, preferably with feet elevated, until the feeling passes.
4. Take the time to enjoy a snack and a drink in the refreshments area immediately after donating.

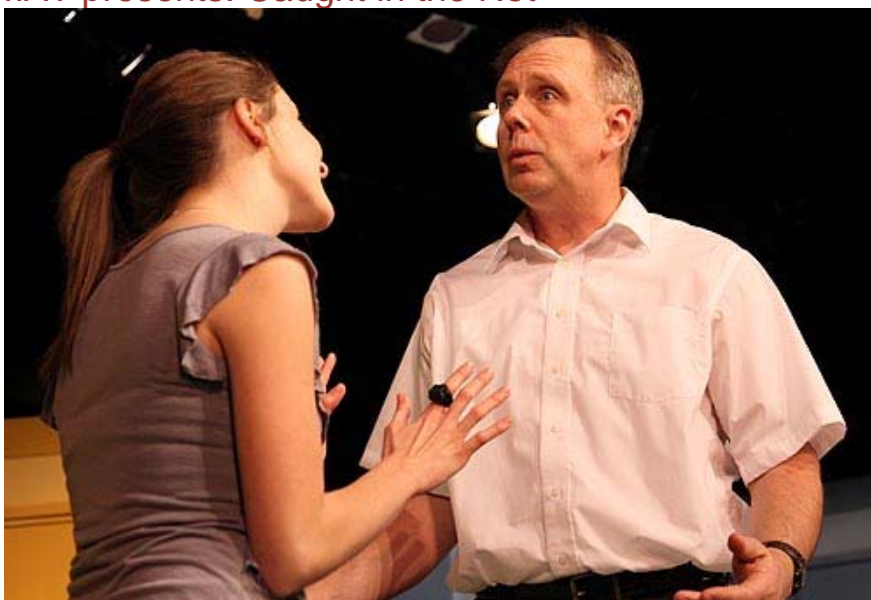

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## Computer Corner

### **Word Tip: Wrapping text around a table**

Most of us tend to position tables between paragraphs of text. You might not realize that you can also position a table in a paragraph and wrap text around the table. By default, the table's Text Wrapping property is None and the table aligns to the left margin of the page. You can use the table handle (the crossed arrows that appear at the upper left hand corner of the table when you hover over or click on the table) to reposition the table.

Word does a decent job of defining properties when you drag the table to position it. However, if dragging the table doesn't get it positioned quite the way you want, you can force settings that are more exact. To access these properties:

1. Right-click the table, choose Table Properties, and click the Table tab (if necessary).
2. Make sure the Text Wrapping property is set to Around.
3. If you want the table flush to the left or right, change the Alignment to Left or Right
4. Click the Positioning button. In the resulting Table Positioning dialog box, you can set the following properties:
  - The horizontal position of the table, relative to a column, margin, or page.
  - The vertical position of the table, relative to a paragraph, margin, or page.
  - The distance of the table from the surrounding (wrapped) text.
  - Whether the table should move with the text.
  - Whether the text can overlap the table.

"National TRIO Day" began in February of 1986 and has since been held the last Saturday each February. With this Saturday, February 26th, being National TRIO day, here is a little more information regarding Northern's Association with TRIO programs. Student Support Services (SSS) is one of three federally funded TRIO grant programs at MSU-Northern. SSS has been a part of Northern since 1979. During that time, Northern has received more than 5.2 million dollars to help approximately 6,600 disadvantaged students. The two other programs are the Educational Opportunity Center (EOC), which began at Northern in 1991 and the Veteran's Upward Bound (VUB) program, which is located on the MSU-Billings campus and began the following year in 1992.

Another connection with TRIO programs is that the North Central Montana Upward Bound Program, under the Fort Belknap Education Department, has housed their summer component on the Northern Campus since 1990.

"National TRIO Day," a day on which the nation is asked to turn its attention to the needs of disadvantaged young people and adults aspiring to improve their lives, to the investment necessary if they are to become contributing citizens of this country, and to the talent which will be wasted if that investment is not made.
