Rape Prevention Lectures - Sept 25

Dr. Alan Berkowitz, PhD. will be presenting two lectures on Monday Sept. 25th. The first will be at 3:00 p.m. in the SUB ballroom for faculty and staff and is called, "Creating a Campus Climate to Prevent Sexual Assault." The second lecture is geared for students and the public and is titled, "Promoting Consent, Preventing Coercion: What You Can do to Prevent Sexual Assault," and will be in the SUB Ballroom at 5:00 p.m. Dr. Berkowitz, received his PhD in Psychology from Cornell University, has over 25 years of experience in higher education as a trainer, psychologist, faculty member, and Counseling Center Director. At Hobart and William Smith Colleges he developed one of the first rape prevention programs for men in the United States, was co-director of the college's highly regarded Men and Masculinity Program and chaired the Prejudice Reduction Task Force.

More recently, he has been a central figure in the development of Social Norms Theory, is a leader in research and implementation of the model, and has been a consultant for a number of highly successful social norms programs. This programming is brought to you by the Rape Prevention and Education Grant, which receives funding through the Department of Health and Human Services.

Workshop: What To Do About Hate Activity in Your Community -Sept. 26

This is an interactive training that will offer everyone a better understanding of what is and what is not a hate crime. Some of the topics that will be covered are introduction and overview of bias crimes; legal issues, legislation, and statutes; how to stabilize a community in crisis, and how to build a community contingency plan. Those who are interested should attend this workshop scheduled, September 26th, 2017 from 8.30 a.m. - 12.30 p.m. at the SubBallroom. This workshop is free and open to the public. This workshop is sponsored by the coordinator of the civil rights US Attorney's Office, Brendan McCarthy, as part of his role is outreach into the community.

Civil Discourse Series - Sept. 27
