



ACADEMIC SENATE PROPOSAL

TITLE: Graduation and General Education Requirements

SUBCOMMITTEE: Gen. Ed. COURSES THAT WERE PROPOSAL # 99-07

PROPOSAL: MSU-Northern will accept articulated ~~courses~~ from the MSU- Great Falls College of Technology and treat them as if they had been taken from MSUN. ~~RESIDENT CREDITS~~ Keep this language

RATIONALE: Since the late 1980's MSU-Northern arranged "dual channel" and course articulation agreements with the Great Falls Vocational Technical College/College of Technology to directly accept courses to satisfy Northern graduation requirements. Since July 1, 1994 MSUN was instructed to withdraw from offering 100-200 level courses in Great Falls as the Board of Regents had designated the MSU CoT to become "more like a community college" to serve the Great Falls region. MSUN is to concentrate on upper division and graduate courses and degrees. In summer 1999 these MSU affiliate units completed a written agreement that formalized this distinction in curriculum concentration. Northern will take deliberate actions to maintain a productive relationship with each degree seeking student, the inter-unit partners, and the citizens of the region

ACTION: Therefore, for degree-seeking students in Great Falls it will be required that they take articulated lower division general education and MSUN approved major and minor courses from the MSU CoT. MSUN recognizes these pre-approved credits as "resident" credit to meet graduation requirements.
